

2020 Camper Application - CampOUT!

Hi there! 😊

Thanks for your interest in CampOUT! July 2-5, 2020. We'd like to get to know you a bit better, so we have some questions about why you'd like to attend CampOUT!.

Please set aside about 40 minutes to complete the online application. On every page, you will have the option to save your application and return to it later! If applications are tricky for you, please ask someone to help you or [contact us](#). If you would prefer to do this by video submission, please [contact us](#). We are able to invite 65 campers to participate in CampOUT!.

Please keep in mind that due to the volume of applications we are unable to accept everyone applying for the first time. We will prioritize youth who applied before but did not attend and youth from rural areas without access to LGBTQ2S+ resources. After you fill out this application, our selections committee will work hard to identify a diverse group to attend this year's camp. Some applicant's will be put on a waitlist and some applicants may be referred to other programs in their area.

If your application is successful, we'll send you an email with a registration form and waivers by May 10th. If you are under 19, please be advised that we will require parent/guardian signatures of consent if you are selected to attend CampOUT! Reach out to us if you would like help figuring out how to talk to your parents/caregivers about your interest in this program.

At that time, a \$60 commitment fee will also be required to hold your place at camp. This \$60 is the only fee required to attend CampOUT! If you are unable to pay the fee, don't worry! Please contact us and we can discuss an alternative way of showing your commitment to attend camp.

If you are not accepted initially, don't lose heart! If you get a spot on the waitlist, there is a chance you'll be offered a spot in June, if not, you will be prioritized for acceptance the second time you apply!

Part 3/3: Reflecting Questions

This section is the heart of the application, where we get a real sense of who you are! And for you to get a better sense of CampOUT! In our work and play, building inclusive and affirming communities, CampOUT! values the practice of self reflection. There is no right answer to these questions! This is an opportunity to reflect and share, and we are honoured to read the experiences you share. The questions may require thoughtful reflection and could take you a little longer than some of the other parts of the application. Please take your time, listen to your own boundaries, and remember that you can save your application and return to it later.

1. Why do you want to attend CampOUT!?
2. CampOUT! values various approaches to "leadership," which can include being a leader in your family, in a small group, one on one, in a large group, or with yourself. We also focus on developing leadership skills (like listening and asking thoughtful questions) in all parts of our lives during our time at CampOUT! What does leadership mean to you?
3. How would you like to practice leadership in your home community?
4. Each of us will come to camp with our own unique experiences. Briefly share a time where you had to overcome challenges or adversity and how this experience shapes who you are today.
5. Every year we work on weaving [intersectionality](#) and solidarity principles into camp life and programming. Specifically, we are committed to creating spaces to explore the intersection of race with gender and sexuality. Not only will there will be opportunities at camp to connect with other leaders and campers who share similar gender and sexuality identities, but there will also be a facilitated opportunity to connect with leaders and campers who share similar racial and ancestral identities and explore this in relation to our different queer, trans, and Two-Spirit experiences! We get to have conversations at camp that might not usually happen in other places in our

lives! CampOUT! is truly a mix of learning together and playing together. It's not your usual summer camp experience!

6. Given that we will spend time at camp exploring multiple identities within LGBTQ2S+ communities, what is your own experience of navigating multiple identities?
